

Message from the Manse

Dear Friends,

Time and time again I come across people who as long as life is going well for them believe in God, but when life is hard they feel that there is no God or that God has no concern for them. It shows that they have a completely wrong understanding of life and of God. God never promised that as long as we believe in Him our life will go well and we will have no real problems. Life is not like that! God tells us in the bible that we live in a fallen world where our bodies decay, illnesses and diseases are widespread, violence and killings are all too common, and death can come at any age. That's why He came into our fallen world in Jesus to be Immanuel, God with us, as we celebrate at Christmas, born as one of us as a tiny, vulnerable baby, to go through all that we go through in our vulnerability, including all the ups and downs, the stresses and strains of life, even acute suffering and death.

The key to successful living is not to have no problems, because living in a fallen world we all have problems and we all go through times when life is hard even if other people are unaware of it. It's a complete and utter myth that some people never have any problems in life. They may not seem to have any, but that doesn't mean that they don't. The key to successful living is not to have no problems but to be able to cope with them in such a way that we don't let them pull us right down. Because having the wrong attitude to life's problems can destroy us and lead to severe depression, and even in some cases death.

So what is the right attitude to have to problems so that we are able to cope with them and survive? Be real. Be real about the world you live in. Be real about yourself. Be real about God. In this fallen world you will have problems and times when life is hard. So when you have problems or life is hard, instead of thinking, "Why me?", think as my wife who has been suffering from two forms of epilepsy, diabetes and thyroid problems for many years now, "Why not me?" In this world where we are all so vulnerable to so many things, why should we be different from everyone else and have no problems or times when life is hard? Heaven is where there are no problems and no suffering,

not this fallen world of ours. So be real about the world you live in.

And be real about yourself. Be real about what you are going through and the difficulties that you have in coping with it. Be real about the fact that you are getting older and so don't have the same energy that you had twenty years ago, and so pace yourself and don't try to do all you did twenty years ago or it will just burn you out and add to your problems! Be real about the fact that you just can't do everything.

Be real about the world you live in. Be real about yourself. And be real about God. Don't worship a god of your own making who you feel should just do as you want. That god doesn't exist. Instead realise that the point of life is to live as God wants. That's why He made us. That's what He designed us for. And especially when you are having problems or finding that life is hard, remember that God loves you so much that He even came into our fallen world with all its suffering and problems as one of us in Jesus to be Immanuel, God with us, as we celebrate at Christmas, to go through all that we go through and even suffer and die for us, not so that you will have no problems in life but so that when you do have problems, when life is hard, when you have questions and doubts, you can share them all with Him who knows what it's like and is more than able to help you and lead you through them so that you come out safe on the other side. The God of the poem "Footprints in the Sand" who came to us in Jesus not so that you will have no problems but to be with us in the problems and even at times carry us through them. But for that to happen you need to be real about the world you live in, to be real about yourself and be real about God, and put yourself in His hands by sharing your whole life, all that you go through with Him, including all your problems, doubts, suffering and pain. For God is not just for us when life is going well. God is also for us when it isn't. That's one of the reasons why He came into our fallen world in Jesus to be Immanuel, God with us, in all that we go through. The key to successful living in our fallen world is to share with Jesus, who is God with us, all that we go through, no matter what it is, honestly and sincerely, to put it all in His hands and trust Him so much that we leave it all there, and look to Him to show us what He wants us to do and to give us all that we need to do that. That's one of the reasons why He came to be born as one of us. That's


one of the reasons why we celebrate Christmas. So don't let your problems get between you and Jesus and push you away from Jesus. Instead let them push you closer to Jesus so that you throw yourself upon Jesus now and forever.

May you know the reality of Jesus as Immanuel, God with us, this Christmas and always.







HOW TO GIVE MONEY TO OUR CHURCH WITHOUT IT COSTING YOU MORE



If you pay Income Tax and want any money you give to your church to be worth more, whether it's through your offering, gift envelopes or whatever, then please make sure that you sign a Gift Aid form, and then put the number on your planned giving envelope, on every gift envelope or on a sealed envelope containing any other donation you give to the church. That way **for every £1 you give, we can reclaim 25p from the Inland Revenue.** If you would like to sign a Gift Aid form or if you would like more information regarding any of this, please see Bill Cross. Remember:

1. It is very easy to do. Anyone, young or old, retired or working, can do this, as long as they pay income Tax, no matter how little. You only need to sign a Gift Aid form once.
 2. For each pound you give the church receives another 25p.
 3. Gift Aid costs you nothing. The extra money has already been paid by you in tax, and is simply being reclaimed from the Inland Revenue, which treats the church as a charity for these purposes.
 4. There are no tricks, pitfalls or difficulties involved. It's all open and above board. It just means extra money for the church at no cost to you in time, money or effort.

CHURCH HOUSE UPDATE

The last 3 months have been busy as we started the new term. We decided to keep with the split in ages that we tried out between January to Easter. After a slow start numbers wise, we have seen a steady increase as we publicise the club wider. The club has been offering the same activities as usual - arts, sports, baking/cooking, soft play, computers. We have been able to call on the help of a couple of new volunteers which is great.

Dalmarnock Primary School have allowed us to do a series of assemblies - entitled the Church House challenge, where each year group had a challenge to do in their house groups. The challenges were based on activities that the children can do at the club, e.g. Art, Dance, Sport etc. The assemblies were well received and we have seen a number of children attend as a result.

Church House has been awarded Glasgow 2014 Legacy branding, an aspect of the Commonwealth Games that aims to ensure that the Games are more than just a sporting event but an inspiration to the communities of Glasgow. Church House has been recognised as a result of the award as a project that can build on the Legacy Vision set out. The award means that we can use the Legacy Logo which in turn will be an asset as we seek funding for the activities we deliver.

We are also in the process of being validated by the Children's University as a 'Learning Destination' - where children and young people can come and have any out of school learning they take part in recorded, recognising that places like Church House offer opportunities for children to learn and develop.

During October week holiday, 4 of the children from Church House and John went to an outdoor sports and mountain biking camp, organised by The GK Experience, at Abernethy Barcaple, which is in Dumfries and Galloway. There were children from various areas of Glasgow and it was a great opportunity for our children to meet some new faces. The weather was surprisingly good and the activities included Canoeing, Mountain biking, Archery, Abseiling, Assault courses and more. We look forward to doing more with The GK Experience in the

future.

We had our Halloween party again this year, however instead of a Disco, we decided to have a series of games- these were Dunking for Apples, Doughnuts on a string, Pass the Polo Mint, Strawberry Lace Chew and the After Eight game. As you may imagine the games involved some mess, skill, embarrassment but overall fun! We decorated the place as usual and the children didn't let us down with their costumes as once again they were excellent and we had a good turnout at both parties.

We have been piloting some work with parents and have started to activities, one a weekly Fitness on a Friday morning and the other a Get cooking practical workshop, weekly for 6 weeks on Wednesday mornings. These have just started and we are excited about how they will develop.

We are in the process of putting together a Christmas Variety Show, so watch this space for more information. The proposed date is Wednesday 18th December at 7.00pm; the show will be free but there will be limited tickets.

We would like to say a big thank you to all our volunteers, without who we wouldn't be able to do deliver the activities that we do. We are grateful for their time and talents as they help with the development of those who attend and the club as a whole.



LHM HARVEST THANKS

LHM have sent a big thank you to everyone who supported them by donating their Harvest Gifts. Over 90 churches, schools and individuals provided harvest gifts. The Glasgow mosque donated a significant quantity of lamb from their Quarbani festival. Without these gifts every year at harvest, LHM would not be able to keep their doors open, as the store cupboard provides cereal & porridge for breakfast, dried lentils, mixed broth, peas etc. makes big pots of daily soup, tea, coffee and sugar donation provides the visitors with free tea and coffee on a daily basis. Greggs the bakers provides daily bread and rolls with pies and sausage rolls being delivered twice a week. So may I take this opportunity to thank all of you who donated to the LHM Harvest, either with food or donation in the LHM Envelopes. £4,900 has been donated so far with more to come and I will update you when Helen sends me the total of our harvest gift envelopes. There is a LHM update thanking everyone just at the tea hatch.

LHM CHRISTMAS STALL

In the hall every Sunday and until Sunday 15 December there will be on sale LHM Christmas cards together with Christmas cards with Scripture and a variety of other Christmas goods. LHM CHRISTMAS APPEAL

They have been discussing for some time the Christmas shoeboxes. They receive 10 times more than they require, and with lack of space and difficult to organise. It was announced at the last Presbytery meeting to consider donating some money in a LHM envelope instead, therefore being able to receive Gift Aid from donations. We here at Bridgeton St Francis in the East have been doing exactly this for a number of years now, so if you feel able to donate in a LHM envelope they are on the LHM Christmas Stall. The long term aim of LHM is to

move away from the shoeboxes and purchase a more personalised individual gift for each service user that should make Christmas feel more special.

LHM - UNDERSTANDING HOMELESSNESS

Homelessness is often a term which is only used for a small group of truly homeless people, rough sleepers, but there is a variety of situations when someone may be classed as being homeless these include: Sleeping rough - Living in temporary accommodation - Living in a squat - Temporary staying with family or friends. Someone might become homeless at the loss of their job, relationship breakdown, eviction or traumatic events in their lives. Homelessness can be caused with having an addiction problem, trying to cope with mental health problems, dealing with domestic violence, sexual abuse or child abuse. In fact homelessness can affect anyone. LHM deal with all of the above on a daily basis. They try to help with a person low self esteem, suicidal tendencies, alcohol and drug problems, mistrust of authority figures, and a lack of being able to read and write and a whole number of other complex issues.

A PRAYER FOR THE HOMELESS

Lord hear our prayer today for all who are homeless. For those who wander the streets both night and day. For families broken and those without relative or friend. For those who feel afraid, find their situation hopeless or have been betrayed. Lord provide shelter, security, hope and friendship to all. Watch over them and keep them safe under the shadow of your wing. AMEN
